Heavy lifting is involved and a van or truck is required.




Completing a pre-authorized giving form or making a private pledge to the wardens helps us plan.


Join us on Mondays in Advent starting November 29th in the upper parish hall. Covid screening (masks and proof of double vaccination) will be in effect.
